**Constandino (Dino) Lambros                      1944 – 2004**

Dino Lambros was born on September 4, 1944 in Newark, New Jersey. He lived in Union Beach until AT&T transferred him to Illinois in 1966, where his daughter, Maria, was born. He moved back to New Jersey in 1978 and married his second wife Jeannie in November of 1979. Maria married Blaine Mason and they have a 10 year old son, Jeremy.

For nearly 40 years, Dino worked for AT&T and Lucent Technologies. As a Distinguished Member of Technical Staff, he was a subject matter expert who consulted organizations in technical and quality areas. Dino's passion for quality and his ability to relate to people at all levels, enabled him to engage others to drive significant organizational change and business success.

Dino's commitment to quality, and business success, led to the AT&T Transmission Systems Business Unit being recognized by the US Department of Commerce with the prestigious Malcolm Baldrige National Quality Award in 1992. He was elected to the Board of Examiners for the Malcolm Baldrige National Quality Award and served the business community by providing consultation and quality examinations of their processes.

Dino liked gardening, Corvettes, writing poems and watching sports, but in addition, Dino was an active member of his community. He was on the Board of Directors of Kidsbridge, a Master Mason in the Keyport Ceasarea Lodge and volunteered for the 9/11 Middletown Memorial fundraisers. Dino was instrumental in the development and building of the Kimisis Tis Theotokou Greek Orthodox Church, in Holmdel, NJ, where he was a member.

Dino was a 1962 graduate of Keyport High School and was inducted into the school's Hall of Fame for LifeTime Accomplishments on October 11, 1997.

Dino fought a long battle against cancer. Dino was first diagnosed with cancer in 1965 at the age of 21, but that did not stop him, he was a cancer survivor. He had additional battles with cancer in 1980, 1985 and 1990 but his zest for life and humanity provided him with the enthusiasm to be an active member of his community. It was through his courage and spirit that, despite all his own health problems he was able to achieve the series of accomplishments enumerated in this biography.

Dino believed that education was key to achievement and success in life. That's why his friends from around the world established the Dino Lambros Memorial Education Fund to provide college scholarships to graduating high school seniors. As of this writing, the scholarship fund continues to surpass its annual and five year goals – testimony to the respect and love for Dino by his friends, and the value he added to each of their lives.

It is for all these reasons that we set out to honor him.
